Last year on October 24 the UCCJ received notice that it had been awarded a sizeable grant from the United Methodist Committee on Relief for support of the victims of the March 11 Disaster of ¥110,000,00 to be used over the next three years. These funds will be supporting the work in Emmaus Sendai, Emmaus Ishinomaki, Hearful Tono, the Little Lambs Camps for the victims of radiation in Fukushima and also preschools and day centers in the disaster area.
